CATCHY COMMENTS

It's amazing what the Fish Managers can do when they are serious about saving a specie of fish that is near collapse. In 1982, the population of adult stripers was at one of the lowest levels ever, but was able to produce their best spawn in decades. The coastal fish Managers knew that the future of the Striped Bass population depended on the 1982-year class. They put together a plan to protect this year class of stripers through the next two decades with the use of moratoriums of catching and keeping stripers, and with slot limits to ensure that this year class would have ample time to spawn year after year. For once, the Managers withstood the pressures put on them by both the commercial and recreational fisherman and protected the striper population. We are now experiencing the results of good management. I just hope that they can look back at this success and apply it to other species that are in trouble.

December provided our anglers with one of the best striper fisheries for big fish on light tackle ever. **Bruce Henderson, Jim Sheffield, Mike Cline, Elly and Robbie Robinson** tried their luck at "eeling" off the Cape Charles area. They had numerous large fish, with several near World Record misses. Jim battled two potential WR fish on 2# test and unfortunately lost both near the boat. Elly landed the best fish, with a 39-0# on 4 general for 650 points for a new club record. Elly also set another club record with a 31-0 on 8 general for 344 points. Bruce was close behind with a 38-0# striper on 4 general for 633 points. Jim took another trip in his flats boat with his wife **Kathi**. She hooked a nice striper and after a long battle, landed a potential woman's line class World Record with a 40-0# on 4 general. That's a 666 point catch. Outstanding catch, Kathi. **Stuart Lee** also fished the Cape Charles area and came away with two new club records, a 42-0# on 16 general for 262 points and a 26-8# on 16# fly for 265 points. **Travis Henderson** set a club record with a 39-0# striper on 6# general for 520 points and **Bob Brown** picked up a new club record with a 26-0# on 8 spin for 325 points. Bob also caught a nice 12-0# bluefish on 8 spin for 200 points. The ocean season should continue to be hot for several more weeks, so get out and catch a striper.


Bill Duval was in Key West and caught a club record 65-8# Wahoo on 16 general for 284 points. **Mickey Kroloff** tried the surf in the Kitty Hawk area and caught 2-4# spotted seatrout for 112 points. Great to see Mickey out wetting a line.

Scott Johnston and **Fred Cousins** were out scouting the Chickahominy River to see what was biting. I heard they had about 25 fish, with an equal split between the fly rod and spin and plug rods. Scott had a 0-12# crappie on 2 fly for 150 points and a 2-1# chain pickerel on 2# fly for 257 points. The private ponds are hot as **Bob Brown** fished with **Mike Ostrander** at Taylor's pond and caught a 7-0# largemouth on 6# spin for 280


Elly and Eastern Shore Bayside striped bass

points. Fred fished a private pond and caught a 6-14# largemouth on 2 spin for 458 points. Soon its yellow perch on the Chick and its not long before the shad are on the Nottoway.

From Washington, DC


From Washington, DC Take I-95 South. Exit 86B onto Route 656, Elmont West. At second light, turn left onto Route 1 South for one mile. Turn left onto Virginia Center Parkway. Follow Virginia Center Parkway for 9/10 of a mile and turn left into the Resort entrance.

From Charlottesville, Virginia

Take I-64 East to I-295 South. Follow I-295 for 8 miles. Stay in right lane and merge "To Exits 43 D-C-B-A, US 1". Take Exit 43C US 1 North to Ashland. Exit ramp will merge onto US 1 North (Brook Road). Follow US 1 for 3/10 of a mile to first stop light at Virginia Center Parkway, turn right. Follow Virginia Center Parkway for 9/10 of a mile and turn left into the Resort entrance.

From Richmond, Virginia & North Carolina


Take I-95 North to Exit 84 B. Exit ramp will merge on to I-295 North. Remain in right lane. Take Exit 43C to Ashland and US 1. Exit ramp will merge onto US 1 North (Brook Road). Follow US 1 to first stop light at Virginia Center Parkway, turn right. Follow Virginia Center Parkway for 9/10 of a mile and turn left into the Resort entrance.

Take I-64 West to I-295 North. Follow I-295 north for 15 miles. Stay in right lane and merge "To Exit 43 B-C-D toward Richmond/Ashland /US 1". Take Exit 43C to Ashland and US 1 North. Exit ramp will merge onto US 1 North (Brook Road). Follow US 1 to first stop light at Virginia Center Parkway, turn right. Follow Virginia Center Parkway for 9/10 of a mile and turn left into the Resort entrance.



VIRGINIA ANGLERS CLUB YOUTH AWARD(S)

Does the kid taken fishing in pursuit of the VAC Youth Awards have to be related to the angler who is taking the kid? A lot of Members may think the kid needs to be kin to the Member. The fact is that any kid will qualify, as long as she/he is 16 or younger and is fishing with a Member. Relationship to the Member is not an issue. Of course, VAC angling rules apply in terms of tackle configuration; bait presentation, landing the catch, etc. Entry cards for the kid's (kids') catches are filled out and submitted by the VAC Member taking the kid fishing. Please write "Youth Award" on the card to be sure the entry card gets proper credit.

How many Youth Awards are offered...one? Maybe two..girl and boy? Nope, there are 6 Youth Awards possible based on age and waters fished. The three age groups are 0 thru 6 years, 7 thru 12 years and 12 thru 17 years of age. Take this one step further by making entries in the fresh and salt water classifications and the total Youth Awards possible is six. Girls and boys are both eligible for the six VAC Youth Awards.

Who is going to take you fishing when you are an old angler? The kids fishing today. Be sure you include time for fishing with kids when making fishing plans for 2007. Someday it may come back to you many times over, although you may still want to pop for fuel and bait.
