

CATCHY COMMENTS

The new 2011 fishing year began the same as did last year, a cold December! The early cold spell the water temperature to drop rapidly in the bay and the Stripers to leave our waters heading either outside the 3-mile limit or south to North Carolina. We are left wondering what the Striper season could have been. Only a few VAC members got a chance to enjoy catching the larger fish. Best fishing tale I heard was of **Fred Murray** fishing with **Stuart Lee** off eastern shore early in the month. They broke ice at the ramp to get the boat in the water, but found fish and stayed on top of Stripers most of the day. They had the luxury of catching them on fly rods with little other pressure from other boat traffic. Great day!

Scott Johnson started the season off by fly fishing at Rudee Inlet in early December. **Scott's** best catch was a 2 pound, 9 ounce, Spotted Seatrout on 6# fly for 128 points. Of course, **Scott** was leading all the categories since this was the first entry of the year. Then, **Fred Cousins** started fishing his favorite place during the winter months, the Hot Ditch off the Elizabeth River.

Fred's first entries from the Elizabeth River are dated December 18th. This is about the time the Chesapeake Bay temperature was falling and very few fish were being caught north of the bay bridge tunnel. The first entries were White Perch. **Fred** had a 1 pound, 4 ounce, on 2# spin for 328 points and 45 minutes later he caught a 1 pound, 2 ounce, Perch on 2# fly for 375 points. Both of these fish are "division" and "species" leaders. The 1-4 pound fish will also take the "heaviest" lead. On the same trip, **Fred** caught a 5 pound Striped Bass on 2# fly worth 166 points. This 5 pound fish will take all the leads for Striper. Last year at this time, **Parks Rountrey** had a 35-8 pound Striper for all the leads which was typical of the quality of fish usually caught in December.

Several days later, **Fred** took **Reggie White** with him to the Hot Ditch. **Reggie** must have lost the "horseshoe", because there were no entry cards from him! **Fred** did manage another "species", "heaviest", and "division" leader with a 4 pound, 7 ounce, Spotted Seatrout that he caught on 2# spin. The trout was worth 295 points.

Reggie and **Fred** were again fishing together on Lake Anna a week later. I believe it was here that **Fred** earned the nickname "**Fernpod**" by **Reggie**. **Fred** did enter a landlocked Striped Bass on 2# spin using a Mirrolure for bait. The fish weighed 5 pounds, 10 ounces. Again, no entry cards from **Reggie**!

Rob Choi braved the cold and was fishing his kayak on the Elizabeth River at the end of December. Even with the rumors of the river being overfished, **Rob** did manage a nice 4 pound, 4 ounce, Spotted Seatrout on 2# spin. **Rob's** fish is worth 283 points; a good beginning for the fishing season.

The cold weather should break in a few weeks; hopefully, the fishing will pick up! So far, it is the **Fred Cousin's** fishing show!

PROGRAM SUGGESTIONS NEEDED FOR 2011

Mike Ostrander is collecting ideas for 2011 programs and seeks your help. Suggestions for programs during 2011 are needed. Don't worry if your suggestion is off the wall or a repeat of a special program we have had in the past. All ideas are welcome. Please let Mike know what your thoughts are.

ANCHOR LINE STORAGE – A NEAT SOLUTION

You pull up to a “honey hole” you often fish and need to anchor up. Out comes the hank of anchor line which drops in a totally entangled pile on the deck. You waste valuable fishing time messing with the tangled mess and getting the line straight and ready to go over the side with the anchor.

A recent issue of *Woodenboat Magazine's* supplement “Getting Started in Boats” was devoted to anchors and anchoring. Within the supplement was the suggestion to use a plastic “milk crate” for anchor line storage.

When stowing the anchor line, coil the line into the crate and stow the crate. When you next need to anchor, pull out the milk crate and set it on the deck. The line will uncoil neatly from the crate and the customary tangle will be eliminated.

The milk crates normally have an external grid that gives the crate good rigidity. If the crate must be cut down to fit into an in-deck or other shallow storage area, the grid will maintain the integrity of the crate. If the resulting edge is sharp, then split a piece of garden hose and cover the rough edges with the slit hose. A little silicon or epoxy can be added to hold the protective edging in place.


JANUARY WEB SITE HOW – FIND A MEMBER PHONE/ADDRESS

The VAC Website, has a two roster of all current members of The Virginia Anglers Club. The rosters have an easily used feature to locate a specific member by first name, last name or both.

Go to the Member's Area and sign in. Under the heading Membership, click on “Roster – Current Members” or “Roster – New Members”. When the roster selected comes up on your monitor, enter the first, last or both names of the member whose address, phone or e-mail address you are seeking in the empty box next to the boxed word “Search”.. Then click on “Search”. The member(s) with the name(s) you have entered will show up. If you enter a first name or a last name only, then all the roster entry for members' whose first or last names that are the same as the name you entered will appear.

Legislation and Conservation

Local News:

Striped bass: I'm sure everyone is aware that there is stop to commercial harvest of striped bass (*Morone saxatilis*) during the month of January, but we also know that not everyone follows the rules. I am happy to say that the U.S. Coast Guard busted a commercial vessel off of North Carolina that had 58 illegal striper on board. However; watermen will continue to engage in illegal activities as long as the penalties are too lax and vendors continue to purchase illegal goods. I believe these are major areas enforcement must address.

Menhaden: Great news from the Atlantic menhaden (*Brevoortia tyrannus*) front, several government officials are taking strides towards fixing this management nightmare. I would like to note Del. Knight's plan of reducing the quota by 20% a year starting in 2012. The current cap is 109,020 metric tons, for those of you who don't like metric that is over 240 million pounds. It is astounding that people think that amount of biomass can be harvested from a confined area and not be hindering the area.

I would also like to acknowledge Sen. Northam and Del. Cosgrove for addressing the obvious. They are pushing for menhaden management to be handled by the VMRC. This would be a huge step in fixing the menhaden fishery problem.

National News:

Oceana's ban on shark finning recently had a big victory. The U.S. House of Representatives approved the Senate version of the Shark Conservation Act, clearing the final hurdle to ending shark finning in U.S. waters. The Shark Conservation Act improves the existing law originally intended to prevent shark finning. It also allows the U.S. to take action against countries whose shark finning restrictions are not as strenuous, labelling the U.S. as a continued leader in shark conservation.

Global News:

The Belizean government announced that all forms of trawling were banned in the country's waters. Oceana in Belize collaborated with Belizean Prime Minister Dean Barrow's administration to negotiate the buy-out of the two shrimp trawlers. With this ban, which went into effect December 31st, Belize became one of the first countries in the world to institute a complete and permanent ban on trawling in all its waters. Trawling is an extremely destructive fishery practice that indiscriminately catches and kills non-target species.

Tournament News

Elizabeth River VA Speckled Trout & Red Drum January 8-9 - RESULTS

We had two brief hard flurries of snow during the tournament. Otherwise conditions were fine and water temps were in the 50's in the ditch area. That was probably the best part of the event as we enjoyed hot homemade Brunswick stew, ham biscuits and coffee. A few anglers were not ashamed to turn in their spike trout catches. 

Gyotaku fish print to be raffled off at the Annual Banquet



***Gyotaku** (Japanese, from gyo "fish" + taku "rubbing") is a traditional form of Japanese fish printing, dating from the mid 1800s, a form of nature printing used by fishermen to record their catches. In order to make a gyotaku print, one places the subject (e.g. fish, crab, scallop shell) on a wooden bench and paints one side with sumi ink. Modern gyotaku artists often substitute acrylic or other painting material for the traditional sumi. (Source - From

SCALE CERTIFICATION COMING UP IN FEBRUARY

The first meeting at which scale certification will be offered will be the February 22, 2011 Membership Meeting. Now is a good time to clean up your scales and to get them in top working order. Remember the following points:

- Clean the outside of the barrel so certification stickers will adhere
- Gather your scales together in one or two Zip Lock type bags.
- Write your name on the outside of the bag.
- Leave your bagged scales on the certification team's table. Your scales will be delivered to you when the certification process is complete.


