**VAC DIRECTORS APPROVE ANGLING RULE
CHANGES FOR 2015**

The Angling Rules Committee met and two changes in the VAC Angling Rules. The rules were approved earlier this month by the VAC Directors. These changes are effective December 1, 2014, the first day of the 2015 Angling Year. Angling Rules Chairman Stuart Lee commented, "There is really only one change which will provide a minimum of division entries for both Fresh and Saltwater annual Angler of the Year awards. Also a sentence was added to better explain acceptable entries of fish that are subject to a closed season and a slot limit". The changes are shown on page 5 of this issue of The Angler.

**TWO PROPOSED BY-LAW AMENDMENTS UP FOR
MEMBERSHIP VOTE AT THE NOVEMBER MEMBER-
SHIP MEETING**

The VAC Directors urge the approval at the November 25th Membership Meeting by a show of hands vote of the following two amendments to Article 4, Dues of the Virginia Anglers Club By-Laws.

The quorum for a VAC Membership Meeting is 20 Members. Passing an amendment to the By-Laws will require a 2/3rds majority vote of those present.

Article IV – Dues (1)

Section 1: Dues for membership in the organization shall be payable in advance. The dues for resident members shall be sixty dollars (\$60) per year. The dues for non-resident members shall be forty dollars (\$40) per year. An initiation fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) shall be required of each member, resident, or non-resident. Dues will be ~~billed and are~~ payable on December 1, the beginning of each angling year. New member's dues shall be prorated monthly from the date of membership to the next billing date (as amended 1-1-73, 3-1-78, 1-12-82, 8-25-97, 2-27-90, 11-22-94, 2-22-05 & 11-27-07, 11-25-14).

~~Section 2: Members whose dues are not paid within ninety (90) days of the date due shall be automatically suspended from membership. Former members may petition the board of directors for reinstatement to full membership. Prorated dues for the balance of the current angling year must accompany such a petition. Such suspended members may petition the board of directors for reinstatement after tendering all arrears and current dues. Any past member who gave a written resignation may be reinstated by paying the current dues and those who did not give a written resignation may be reinstated by paying the current dues and initiation fee;~~

INTRODUCING THE POINTS CALCULATOR A NEW FEATURE ON THE WEBSITE

Webmaster Johnny Wetlaufer has posted a new POINTS CALCULATOR in the “Members Area” of the VAC Website. Some Members have already found this new piece of handy software. The POINTS CALCULATOR allows members to calculate the points for any actual catch or any made-up data entered. If any of the data does not comply with the VAC Angling Rules or cover a species the VAC recognizes, the calculator will so note.

The POINTS CALCULATOR is easy to use. Species, line weight and division into which the entry is to be made are selected from drop down menus. Only the catch weight in pounds and ounces needs to be typed in. Hit “CALCULATE” and the points are automatically presented; an erroneous entry is also noted.

If you carry an iPhone or similar device that allows you to connect to the internet and hence to the VAC Website, you can calculate the points for a fish just caught and weighed, even before it is released or consigned to the frying pan. While you have the VAC Website in the palm of your hand, why not check to see if you have caught a New Club Record or a new leader in the Lunker Club.

MAGGIE BILLINGSLEA





VAC DIRECTORS APPROVE ANGLING RULE CHANGES FOR 2015

Here, highlighted in yellow, are the changes in the VAC Angling Rules for the 2015 Angling Year.

Eligible fish and minimum weights

The species eligible for entry and the basic weights for 100 points are listed on the current club record sheets and the basic weight summary sheets. The minimum weight acceptable for any entry is 50 percent of the basic weight. It is the intent of the VAC to support conservation efforts in managing marine fisheries and to abide by all regulations governing recreational fishing. Therefore, any entry for a fish caught during a closed season for a specified body of water will not be accepted.

Entry of a fish that is subject to a slot-limit falling outside the slot is permitted as long as it is released.

15(D) Angler of the Year Award

Freshwater, Saltwater, and Overall Angler of the Year awards have been established to recognize the VAC member who, through his angling accomplishments in local waters, has demonstrated his skill in all tackle divisions across multiple fish species.

Criteria:

- 100 point minimum entry
- Only fish caught in local waters
- Only fish caught in the current angling year
- No fish species can be duplicated
- In saltwater, one entry per division; winner has most cumulative points **(entries for all five divisions are required)**
- In freshwater, one entry per division plus one optional entry once each of the four division entries are made; winner has most cumulative points **(entries for all five divisions are required)**
- Overall Angler determined by adding Freshwater and Saltwater totals
- Member shall submit application, including a list of entries, for consideration for the Angler of the Year awards to Angling Rules Committee by December 15.

VAC SURF TEAM IMPROVES PERFORMANCE IN THE CHAC INVITATIONAL

Sometime prior to departing for Buxton, NC, VAC Surf Team Captain Quent Corbett boldly stated, “We are going to redeem ourselves after such a terrible finish last year (2013). Maybe the luck of the draw will give us some better locations on the beach”. Quent’s and his team mates brought a respectable amount of redemption home from this year’s tournament, but the luck-of-the-draw let them down in at least one session of the Cape Hatteras Anglers Club Invitational Surf Fishing Tournament. Quent submitted the following report of how the VAC Surf Team fared this year.

“The 57th Annual Cape Hatteras Anglers Club fishing tournament has concluded with the Virginia Anglers Club finishing 81st. While this isn’t something to brag about it was a distinctive improvement over last year (105th out of 120 teams). All team members scored points for a total of 42 with 14 scoring fish. However, we caught well over 100 of 8 to 10 inch fish. Gary Martel was the leader in that category with impressive doubles of skates. The biggest disappointment was drawing a site in Salvo where there were no fish and a sand bar. There were no fish scored during that last session. Maybe there will be continued improvement next year.”

This tournament is the world’s largest surf fishing tournament according to the *Guinness Book of World Records*. The tournament’s popularity is attested to by a waiting list of 70 surf fishing teams. The members of the team this year were Quent Corbett (Captain), Billy Corbett, Eric Millham, Jim Stout, Gary Martel and Steve Bizbing. Thanks, Anglers, for your time and interest to represent the Virginia Anglers Club for the 53rd year in this extremely popular tournament.

FROM RECENT EDITIONS OF DGIIF'S THE OUTDOOR REPORT
PRAISE THE LORD, BUT, PLEASE, NOT HERE

Unpermitted Use of VDGIF Property - On Sunday, September 15, Senior Conservation Police Officer Jessica Whirley received a call that hundreds of people were at the VDGIF Cartersville boat ramp on the James River in Cumberland County. Apparently there were a number of churches holding a mass baptism in the river. The complaint was that the ramp was being blocked for boating access and that the churches did not have a permit to use the ramp. By the time Whirley arrived, the baptisms were complete and Sunday supper had broken out. Officer Whirley parted the crowd and spoke to the Pastor in charge for the event and politely explained to him that a permit from the Department of Game & Inland Fisheries was required to use the ramp for anything other than fishing and boating. She also pointed out that with the number of people there, boaters could not easily get to the ramp. The Pastor was apologetic and agreed to disperse the assembly.

Through her evaluation of the situation, Officer Whirley appropriately handled the complaint by giving a warning for the misuse of VDGIF property. Everyone left amicably and went their separate ways.

NEXT TOURNAMENT - JAMES RIVER (CHIPPOKES CREEK) GAR NOVEMBER 22ND THRU 23RD. (NO BLOW DATE)

Some nice gar can be found in many places in the James River system - including the Chickahominy, but this time of year Chippokes Creek (just off the James) is the top venue for club members seeking large gar. There are many access points on the Chick and the James. Those who want to fish Chippokes can reach the area by leaving from the free Morris Creek Ramp in the Chickahominy Wildlife Management Area <http://www.dgif.virginia.gov/wmas/detail.asp?pid=1> or for a fee use the more convenient James City County Riverfront Park Ramp <http://www.jcegov.com/recreation/parks/chickahominy-park.html> on the East end of the Route 5 Bridge over the Chick.

Times: All Saturday and Sunday

Tips: The fish will eat large minnows, suspended live - or dead on the bottom. They range from 2 to 17 lbs. and can easily be caught on 2# or 4# test with 8# mono leader. They also will take artificial baits if you have the patience to miss many hookups and stick with casting.

Entries must be turned in within 24 hours of the tournament ending to Acting Angling Activities Chairman Parks Rountrey. You cannot change an entry once you have registered it with the Chairman. You do not need to fill out cards to turn in for the tournament, but do need a card if you want your to be registered as a club entry.

Tournament First Place Awards for both weight and points = Anglers Choice: Traditional pewter cup, \$40 Green Top gift card or a VAC Banquet ticket.

VIRGINIA / NORTH CAROLINA STRIPED BASS TOURNAMENT DECEMBER 13TH THRU 31ST (NO BLOW DATE)

Our tourney will be at peak time for big winter Rockfish. Drifting live baits or conventional trolling are preferred methods for the heaviest fish. For light tackle points - various soft plastic baits are effective on light spinning and plug gear. Fly fishing is also productive when you can find fish near the surface. A number of club members like to fish Cape Charles and CBBT areas this time of year, but you can fish any Virginia or North Carolina salt waters. Remember - this is our first tournament for the new angling year - so be sure to plan on fishing.

Need Crew? Consider introducing a New Member to striper fishing. The offer will be really be appreciated and the day spent together might even start a new friendship.

Two ways to win! We will recognize three places for heaviest weight fish and three places for highest point fish. First = 3 pts. Second = 2 pts. Third = 1 pt. These points will apply towards the annual Salt Water Tournament Angler of the Year competition. Two fish can be entered per angler. A fish can be entered by weight or points (angler must declare which category) but not both ways for 1 fish.


