Lines Out - Gary Donahue

Former Virginia Anglers Club Gary Donahue, 84, pulled lines for the final time on Thursday, January 27, 2022. Gary will likely be remembered by members of long standing.

Gary was a Member of the VAC for 30 years and was most active from the late 1980's thru the early 2000's. Gary joined the VAC as a resident member in 1987 and ended his membership in 2017 due to declining health.

Gary entered only one saltwater entry in his 24 entries in the club data base. Five of Gary's entries still stand as VAC Club Records (a 3-2 croaker 4 lb. gen., a 31-5 chinook salmon on 16 lb. gen., an 8-2 walleye on 4 lb. spin, a 12-0 northern pike on 12-0 on 2 lb. spin. and a 2-14 crappie on 2 lb. fly.). Gary's record crappie was caught in 1991 and his record croaker was caught in 2004. The other three records have stood since 1993.
