CATCHY COMMENTS

The fishing has been phenomenal since the last newsletter. **Billy Nicar** started off the month with 331 point Flathead Catfish.

Billy was fishing the James River with a live Goldfish to land the 24 pound, 8 ounce fish on 4# general.

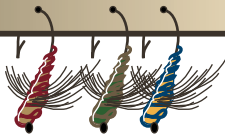
Scott Johnston had a great day fishing with **Norman Miller** on the "Rascal" off Ocracoke. **Scott** entered the "heaviest" Amberjack using a live Croaker for bait. The fish bottomed out a 30# scale, but that was the biggest scale on board that day. On the same trip, **Scott** also entered a Barracuda that weighed 15 pounds 4 ounces on 12# spin for another "heaviest" lead. Several weeks later fishing in freshwater, **Scott** caught a 10 pound Blue catfish on 8# plug for a new Club Record.

Mike Cline and **Robbie Robinson** continued to fish the CBBT for Flounder in August. **Mike** managed a 5 pound 2 ounce Flounder on 8# plug using a jig/Gulp combination bait. The Flounder is worth 213 points and is a new Club Record. The by-catch that day were two 14 Red drum, one by each of them, which turned out to be the beginning of the great drum run. A week later on August 28th, both of them landed several larger drum. **Robbie** had a 42 pound on 8# spin for 525 points. The fish takes the "spin division" lead and also the "heaviest" lead. Not to be out done, **Mike** landed a 45 pound Red Drum on 8# plug for 562 points which was standing real tall until **Fred Cousins** went Drum fishing with Parks Rountrey.

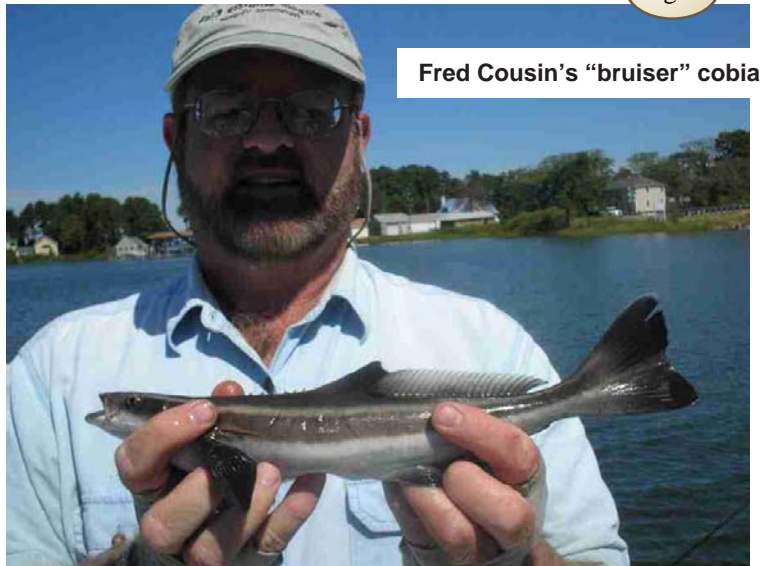
After **Fred** had his weekly telephone conversation with **Elly Robinson**, **Fred** was eager to try some tips that **Elly** had passed along about the Red Drum fishing. **Fred** was using 6# plug and landed a 38 pound, 8 ounce drum worth a whopping 592 points. The fish leads the "plug" division, takes the "species" lead, and also is a new Club Record. Nice work by all!

Joe Witte was fishing a pond in Rockville and entered several nice Sunfish. **Joe** had an 8 ounce fish on 2# spin for 131 points and his best Sunfish was a 12 ounces on 6# fly for 170 points.

Matt Balazik had several more entries since the last meeting. **Matt** entered a 206 point Carp fishing with **Parks Rountrey**. The fish weighed 10 pounds 5 ounces using corn for bait on 4# general. **Matt** was fishing the mouth of Back River several weeks later and landed a 2 pound, 4 ounce, 300 point Croaker on 2# spin. The fish now leads the "species" and "heaviest" for croaker.



Bob Shepherd had a fantastic month of fishing in saltwater. He started off with a 63 pound Red Drum on braid for 210 points. This fish leads the “heaviest” category, the Club Record for braid, and will be really hard to beat. Next, **Fred Murray** and **Bob** were fishing the Cell. **Bob** landed a 1 pound 14 ounce Croaker on 2# spin for 250 points. Still at the Cell several days later, **Bob** caught a 45 pound Cobia on braid for a new Club Record and the lead in the “heaviest” category. **Fred Murray** also had some quality fish but doesn’t turn in many entry cards. **Bob** still wasn’t done yet. Off Virginia Beach the first of September, **Bob** was using 12# plug and landed another Cobia weighing 43 pounds. The fish will take the “species” lead and is worth 286 points. Nice run **Bob!**

Parks Rountrey also had some good entries . **Parks** caught a 10 ounce Sunfish on 2# fly on a private pond worth 208 points. Then, he went to the James River to catch some Flathead Catfish and Carp. The Flathead was 25 pounds on 4# general for 338 points using a live Bream for bait. The Carp weighed 22 pounds and was also caught on 4# general using corn for bait. The 440 point fish takes the “species” lead and is also a Club Record. Fishing the CBBT on September 11th, **Parks** caught a 38 pound Red Drum on 8# spin fishing with **Bob Brown**. The 475 point fish was caught with a bucktail jig. If there was an award for fishing with the most club members during a month, Parks would win it , hands down!

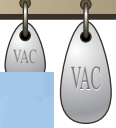

September is for Speckled Trout

How about a fisherman that has taken 47 Speckled Trout over 12lbs (and released them)! Well, for our September program we have Capt. Blake Hayden speaking to the club and he will share his secrets as to how he does it. Capt. Hayden grew up on the eastern shore and caught his first speckle on a mirrorlure at age 10 in Hungars Creek.

He moved to the "other side" and discovered the great fishery in the Elizabeth River. In the past 23yrs he has developed his craft to a science. Blake will talk to us about live baiting, dead baiting, lure fishing, free lining, and trolling, and most importantly when to do the various techniques. He will talk weather patterns, tide phases, moon phases, water temps and how it affects the bite. We will also lean about how the trout relate to structure and areas to look for in pursuit of these great fish. Don't miss this one.

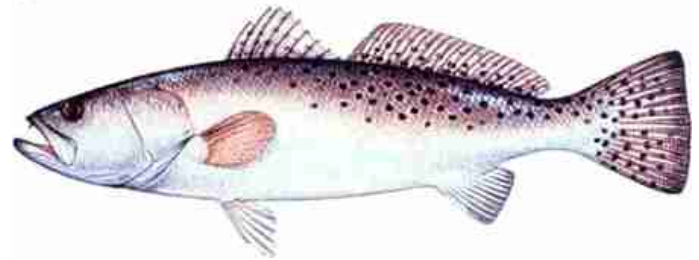
DON'T HUNT OVER A CROP THAT HAS BEEN DECLARED A FAILURE

Since quite a few Members of the VAC are ardent hunters, here is a short "word to the wise" about hunting over a field on which a crop was grown, failed to adequately produce and was declared a failure. Because of the severe drought this summer, many farmers have had their crops declared "failures" and had to destroy whatever there was of the crop to qualify for proceeds from crop insurance programs. Destruction typically means bush hogging the crop and disking the shredded crop parts in.

The US Fish & Wildlife Service (USFWS) Office of Law Enforcement in Richmond states that under existing definitions and case law, waterfowl cannot be hunted in fields that have been manipulated after being declared "crop failures due to drought". Many hunters incorrectly assume this practice is a "bona fide" agriculture practice. With widespread drought and crop failures this year throughout the Mid-Atlantic region, questions from hunters for what was legal prompted the USFWS to make the determination.

New River Smallmouth Tournament: September 25 & 26

We have coordinated with Tangent Outfitters <http://www.newrivertrail.com/> to accommodate our smallmouth Tournament. For booking, contact is Shawn Hash: cell 540-257-0415 office 540-626-4567. e-mail tangentoutfitter@gmail.com Tell him you are with VAC group.

Everybody will do their own pairing and booking. If you are not yet booked, you should do your bookings very soon! Tournament will be Saturday and Sunday and have weight and points divisions as usual. There will not be a blow date due to conflicts with Tech games and logistics of moving everything. If weather is poor make your own decisions about fishing.

Fishing Guides:

Guide and two per boat cost \$400 per day (\$200 each angler). If you want to fish only half day Sunday, that is \$285 per boat. If you want to do your own thing and take your own boat that is fine.

Accommodations:

Accommodations run from about \$50 per person per day for cabins and basic rooms to \$279 per room for a very nice B&B. I assume most people would come in Fri evening and drive home Sunday evening. Sunday night stay-over is of course possible too. We will likely set up a group dinner at Palisades Restaurant for Sat. night.

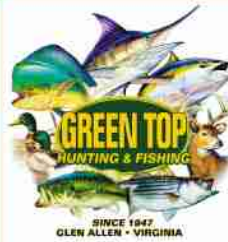
