FUN FISHING FLOAT TRIP SATURDAY JULY 19TH

The Virginia Anglers Club has organized a float trip for Saturday July 19 on the middle James River. Program Co-Chair Steve Knox is organizing the trip. The float will be from the put-in at the Hardware River WMA to Bremo Bluff, a float of about seven miles. No tournament, no race, just a fun float down a beautiful part of the James.

This is a prime section of the river for smallmouth fishing, so bring your scales! Depending on your fishing speed and the river level, the float should take about eight hours. You are on your own to get your kayak/canoe/jon boat (float tube?) to the launch and arrange for a shuttle partner. If you are having difficulty arranging a shuttle partner let Steve know – sknox@knoxmarine.com or cell 840.9460. The rough plan is to launch about 7:00 AM. The drive from Richmond is an hour plus or minus, depending on where you live. We may be able to provide a "mother ship" to carry coolers etc., but just in case you should plan on carrying your own cooler, gear etc.

Please let Steve know if are planning to make the float. If you need a shuttle partner let him know. Tell Steve what sort of vehicle and boat you have so that he can pair appropriate shuttle vehicles.

He can also probably find a loaner kayak for anyone who wants to try the float trip but doesn't have a boat.

Mark your calendar – Steve will provide additional details about the launch and takeout locations etc. as the date approaches. Be sure to let him know if you plan to float.

Steve and Bob Brown did a "trial float" on June 19. The water level at Scottsville was 4.0', at Bremo's Bluff 8.5'. We launched at 0800 and took out at 1315. We paddled a little but mostly just drifted and fished. We never anchored. Anyone who routinely paddles Pony Pasture in the summer can make this run at these river levels.

From the time we met at Bremo's Bluff to launch (i.e. the shuttle time) was \sim 45 minutes.

Bruce Ingram's guide book recommended river right around Big Island. We missed that turn and went river left. That direction was ok. Another map I have since bought recommends river right. Take your pick.

There is a long stretch from the end of Big Island to the takeout. About half way down this stretch there's a private concrete ramp on the right. Just past that is another concrete ramp at a campground. Either place would be a good stop for lunch and a stretch. There are no other good stopping places on that stretch.











THE IGFA IS SEVENTY-FIVE YEARS OLD THIS YEAR

(Based on the "IGFA President's Message" International Angler, Vol. 77, Issue 3)

The fact that the International Game Fish Association is celebrating their 75th Anniversary this year may have slipped up on many of the members of the Virginia Anglers Club. We also likely are not aware that the American Museum of Natural History in New York had a significant impact the formation of the IGFA. We use the IGFA Rules as the basis of our angling record and award systems, but may not think much about the scientific activities of the IGFA, the basis for its initial establishment.

Early rules for "gentlemanly and sporting conduct in marine game fish angling" were in effect in a few fishing clubs. In the late 1930s, some members of the British Tunny Club hoped to establish a center in England to "formulate rules for ethical angling". However, the onset of WW II brought this activity to a halt.

Michael Lerner provided funding and leadership for American fishing expeditions to many countries. When Michael went on a fishing expedition to Australia he met one the country's finest anglers, Clive Frith. During conversations with Clive, Clive suggested that Americans should "devise and administer" international angling rules.

Dr. William King Gregory, head of he department of ichthyology and comparative anatomy at the Museum, heard about Clive's suggestion. Dr. Gregory thought such an organization was a natural to affiliate with his department at the Museum and could provide scientific data for the use of the Museum.

On June 7, 1939, the IGFA was founded at a meeting at the American Museum of Natural History. Those present at the meeting were Dr. Gregory (became the first president of the IGFA, Michael Lerner, writer Van Campen Heilner and Francesca LaMonte, associate curator of fishes for the Museum and science leader of many of Mr. Lerner's expeditions.

In conclusion of his IGFA President's Message noted above, Rob Kramer states "Seventy-five years later, the IGFA is still diligently maintaining the world's angling rules and records. Additionally, now more than ever, we continue to connect anglers with scientists in an effort to gain much needed information to protect the world's game fish species."

As a Member Club of the IGFA, with many individual VAC members who are also members of the IGFA, the Virginia Anglers Club benefits from the scientific and archival services the IGFA provides for all anglers. We all know that many VAC Members have or currently hold IGFA World Angling Records and the angling rules of the IGFA are the foundation for participation in the VAC system of club records and catch entry.



about tournament competition, but competition with ourselves." One of the great aspects of the Virginia Anglers Club is the levels for individual anglers to achieve.

Everyone comes into the VAC as a novice, it is just a starting point, a way for all to start with a clean slate. The first step of progression is to become an angler. All that is needed to achieve this rating is to catch 10 different species of fish. Just a released fish. Not a big fish, just a catch and release.

The next level of accomplishment is to earn your Expert Rating. And you can do this in either fresh or salt water. All entries for this level must be at least 100 points but it gets a little more involved. You must also have entries in each of the divisions; Fly, Spin, Plug, and General and also Surf on the salt water side. Check out your rule book for all the nitty gritty details.

Then there is the Master Angler rating but let's save that for later. And all the above is competition between you and your quarry, just you and the fish.

With that said, five members of the Virginia Anglers Club and a guest, 13 year old John Jones took to the James River by foot from Pony Pasture. David Nobles, Eric Webster, Steve Knox, Mike Ostrander and George Atkinson geared up and headed out for a five hour wade fishing trip. It was a beautiful morning and the river was flowing at a height for wade fishing. After all the rock hopping and miles of river fished, the group caught and released about two dozen fish. The largest fish of the day was a smallmouth bass about 14", but the best tale of the day was given by Eric, one of the three who fly fished. Eric landed a few fish, but it was the one that got away that raised our eyebrows. Eric said, "I was stripping a size 8 olive Woolly Bugger pattern across a riffle when the fly snagged on the bottom. Then the bottom moved. I set the hook and my 8-weight rod bent double. I fought what felt like a nice fish for a couple of seconds. The fish turned downstream, got into the main current seam and broke the fly off cleanly from my 6 lb. tippet." Six pound smallie? Striped bass? Catfish?

As for me, my highlight was watching an osprey fishing early in the morning ... flying around and hovering at times. I was fishing a buzz bait and the osprey took an interest in it as he paused for a moment, hovered in place and quickly began to drop towards it. Noticing this I began to reel my line in as fast as I could and that faster movement just got the osprey more excited and focused as he dove in even closer. The osprey was about 5 'above the lure and well less than 20' in front of me when it finally saw me and made a quick aerial move away. It's amazing how focused they can be when fishing... if only I was too.

VIRGINIA/CAROLINA FLOUNDER TOURNAMENT JULY 19TH AND 20TH

(BLOW DATE FOLLOWING WEEKEND)

"Door Mat" Flounder action will peak in Mid-Summer and we have a tournament right on time. The tournament is open to all Virginia and North Carolina waters. Popular spots for large flounder this time of year include the buoy 36 area and the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Tunnel in VA. Inlets and wrecks are most popular in NC.

WE WILL RECOGNIZE THREE PLACES FOR HEAVIEST WEIGHT FISH AND THREE PLACES FOR HIGHEST POINT FISH. FIRST = 3 PTS. SECOND = 2 PTS. THIRD = 1 PT. THESE POINTS WILL APPLY TOWARDS THE ANNUAL SALTWATER TOURNAMENT ANGLER OF THE YEAR COMPETITION. A FISH CAN BE ENTERED BY WEIGHT OR POINTS (ANGLER MUST DECLARE WHICH CATEGORY) BUT NOT BOTH WAYS FOR 1 FISH. ONE ANGLER CAN ENTER ONLY TWO FISH. IT IS POSSIBLE TO WIN BOTH WEIGHT AND POINTS DIVISIONS BY ENTERING 2 DIFFERENT FISH.




